

Volunteer Code of Conduct

Casa Esperanza is a community rooted in dignity, respect, and mutual support. To maintain a safe and welcoming environment, volunteers are asked to adhere to the following guidelines:

- Foster Hospitality: Help create a warm and welcoming atmosphere for all residents, staff, and visitors.
- Respect Privacy: Refrain from taking photos or asking personal questions of residents.
- Maintain Confidentiality: Protect the identity and information of those residing or receiving services at Casa Esperanza.
- **Show Respect and Inclusivity:** Treat everyone with respect, regardless of age, gender, culture, language, ethnicity, religion, or sexual orientation.
- No Personal Transactions: Do not borrow, lend, give, or receive money or personal items from residents or children.
- **Coordinate Your Service:** Commit to scheduled volunteer times and coordinate activities with Casa Esperanza staff.
- Use Appropriate Communication: Avoid physical force, verbal violence, or hurtful language.
- **Limit Physical Contact:** For safety, refrain from carrying children, sitting them on laps, or engaging in physical play.
- Avoid Sharing Personal Information: Do not exchange personal details such as phone numbers or social media
 accounts with residents.
- No Drugs or Alcohol: Do not bring or use drugs or alcohol on the premises at any time.
- **Limit Public Displays of Affection:** Volunteers should avoid public displays of affection, which may make others uncomfortable.
- Show Fairness: Treat all individuals equally, showing no favoritism or inappropriate affection.
- Stay in Common Areas: Volunteers should remain in open, supervised spaces.

By following these guidelines, volunteers help maintain a safe and respectful environment, ensuring Casa Esperanza continues to be a supportive and healing community.
